Project Overview

The City of Lawrence seeks funding from the U.S. Department of Transportation for funding available through the Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) program for their Comprehensive Safety Action Plan implementation project which includes implementing transformative safety improvements aimed at eliminating roadway facilities and serious injuries.

This opportunity is a discretionary BIL program with a local match requirement of 20% of the total project cost. The entity is requesting \$76,000.00 from the Build Kansas Fund, and is providing a local match of \$4,000.00. This request has the potential to unlock \$320,000.00 in federal funds, for a total project cost of \$400,000.00.

The deadline is June 26, 2025, and this Build Kansas Fund application was received on May 2, 2025.

However, given the City's current fiscal challenges, including a need to reduce expenditures by over \$6 million, allocating funds to new projects or studies would necessitate reallocation or cuts to existing programs. As a result, identifying local funding sources for this initiative has proven to be exceptionally difficult



The City of Lawrence, in partnership with the Lawrence–Douglas County Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO), developed a bold and data-driven Vision Zero Transportation Safety Action Plan with support from a Fiscal Year 2022 Safe Streets for All (SS4A) grant. This plan lays the groundwork for transformative safety improvements aimed at eliminating roadway fatalities and serious injuries for all users – whether they walk, bike, ride transit, or drive.

To advance this vision, City staff have prioritized a set of low-cost, high-impact, short-term strategies that are both feasible within the next year and focus on the most vulnerable users and corridors with the highest rates of severe crashes. These projects include:

- Road Safety Audits on the 6th Street and 23rd Street corridors
- A demonstration of Leading Pedestrian Intervals (LPIs)



The targeted segments of 6th Street (Kasold Drive to Massachusetts Street) and 23rd Street (Iowa Street to Massachusetts Street) lie within the city's High Injury Network. These corridors are hotspots for serious crashes due to heavy traffic volumes, wide roadways, and frequent conflicts between drivers and pedestrians or cyclists. The audits will evaluate opportunities for improvements such as raised median islands, crossing improvements, geometric improvements, better lighting, and access management strategies—tools proven to reduce crashes and save lives. During the audit and corridor study process, staff will engage a broad range of public and private stakeholders. This robust community engagement will ensure diverse perspectives are represented, and feedback gathered will be carefully analyzed and integrated into the Safety Action Plan appendix.

In parallel, the city will pilot Leading Pedestrian Intervals (LPIs) at key intersections, particularly downtown and near Safe Routes to School signalized intersections. Backed by FHWA research showing a 13% reduction in pedestrian crashes, LPIs give people walking across the street a head-start before vehicles get the green light, improving visibility and safety.

These near-term initiatives will serve as catalysts for longer-term, systemic change. Findings from the road safety audits will be integrated into an appendix to the existing Safety Action Plan, helping to guide future capital investments. Based on data from the LPI pilot, such as driver yield rates and crash reductions, the City may also propose a policy for broader implementation.

By building on momentum from our newly adopted Action Plan and targeting the highestrisk areas and users, these projects will lead to a significant reduction or elimination of roadway fatalities and serious injuries involving various road users.
