BIL Overview

- Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL)
 - AKA Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA)
- National Infrastructure Investment = \$1.2 Trillion across 5 years
 - Nearly 400 programs across 12 Federal Agencies
 - 60% Formula / 40% Discretionary

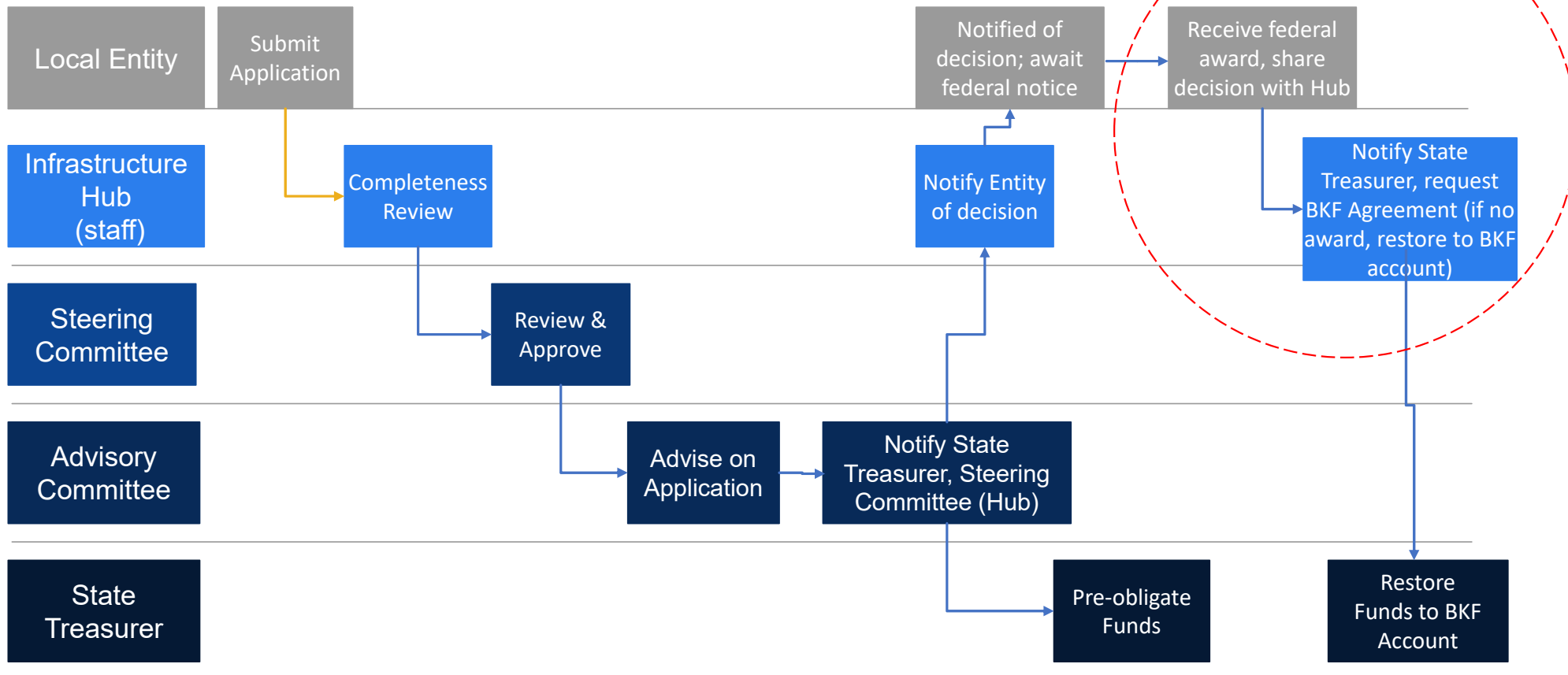

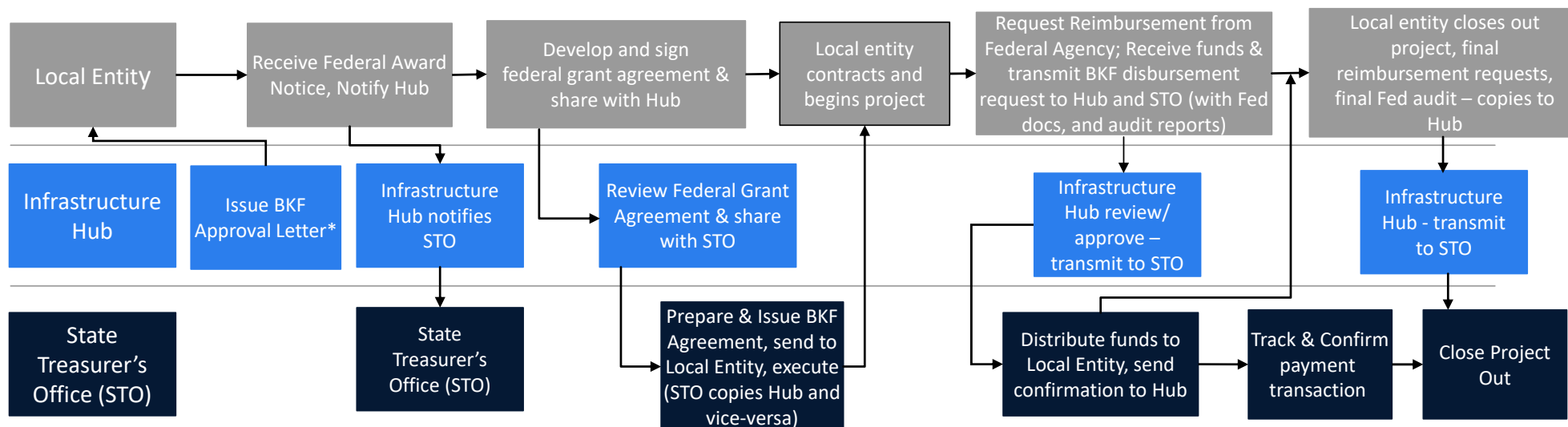

Build Kansas Fund | STO Reimbursement Process

**Note – this process begins after the BKF Application is approved by Steering Committee and Advisory Committee*



Key Assumptions: Federal program is reimbursement based; BKF will be distributed after federal reimbursement is made and appropriate documentation is provided; Oversight and compliance is performed by federal funding agency and expected to satisfy BKF needs; Distribution of funds will occur in a cadence defined by federal award.

Federal BIL program award notification timelines unknown

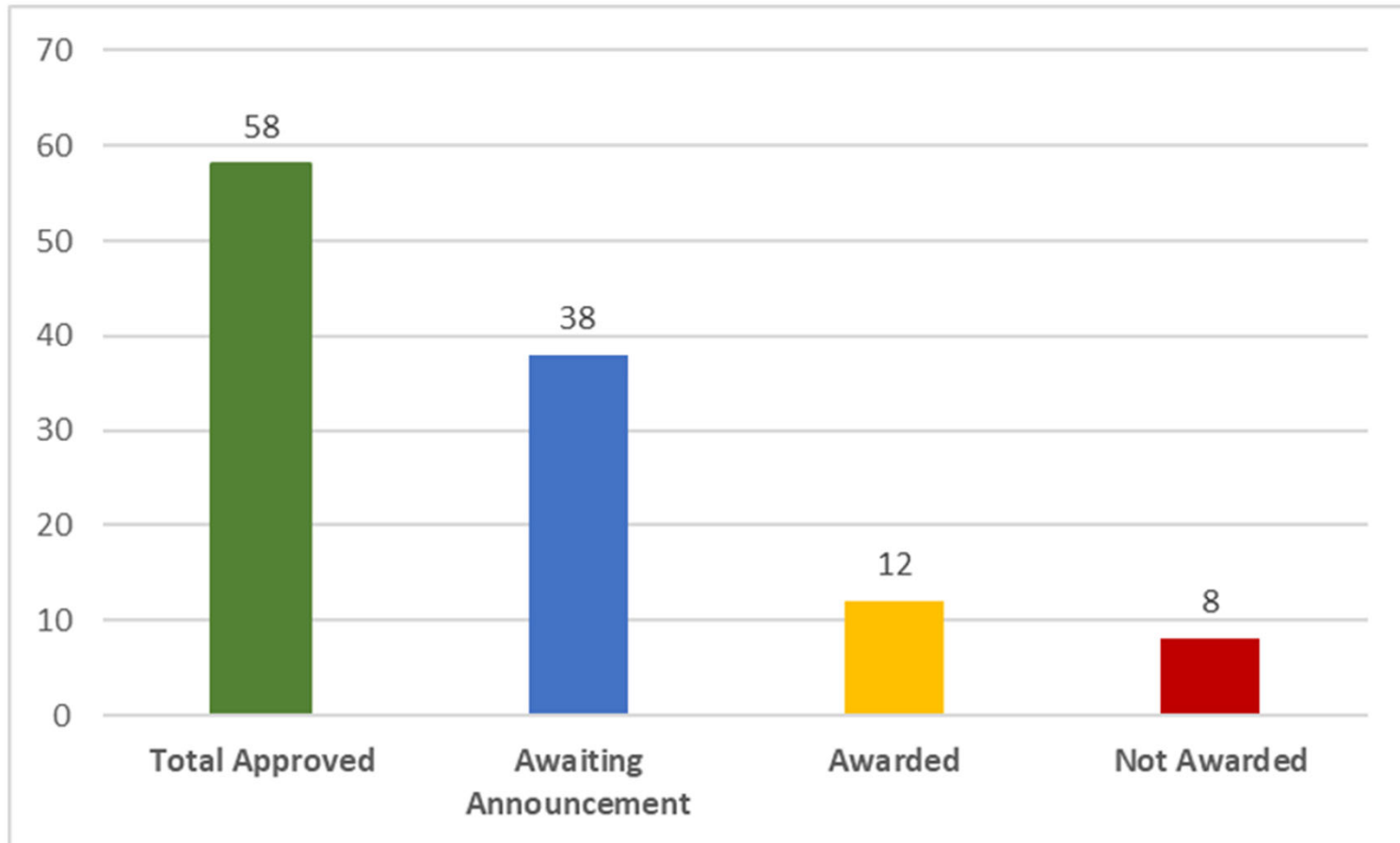
Build Kansas funds are contingent upon federal BIL program award notice



Important notes

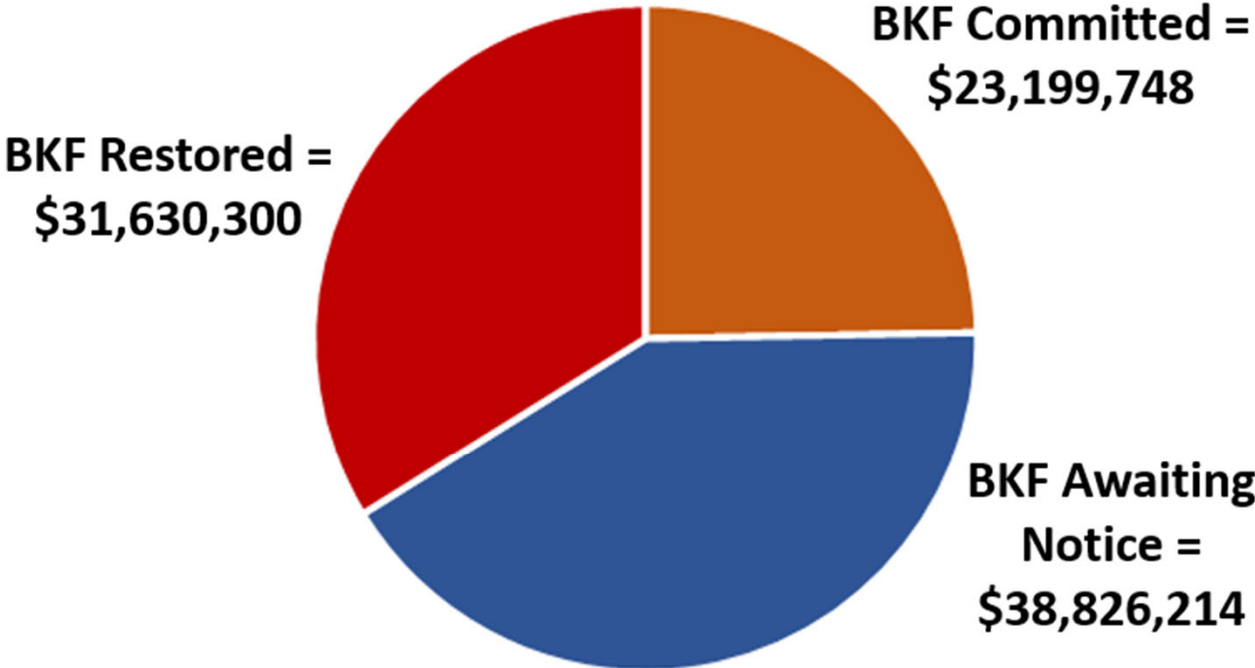
- The Hub is **not** selecting projects
 - The Hub serves in an advisory capacity
- Projects only receive Build Kansas Funds **if awarded** a federal grant
 - Federal agencies make project selections and provide award notification
- **This is additive only**
 - Communities can apply without requesting Technical Assistance OR making a Build Kansas Fund Application

Kansas Grant Wins through BKF

City of Edgerton

- Awarded a Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) grant in the amount of \$220,000.
- The City of Edgerton did receive TA from the Hub and will receive \$45,000 through BKF (2024-027).
- The Edgerton Safety Action Plan will include data gathering measures to identify safety related problems and provide strategies to address and remedy those problems. This plan will incorporate community input and collaborate with connected stakeholders like Johnson County, KDOT, and other connected transportation entities to create an inclusive approach to safety. The Edgerton Safety Action Plan will establish achievable goals for the City to greatly reduce crash severity as well as improve the safety culture in our community.

FY2025 Build Kansas Fund Schedule

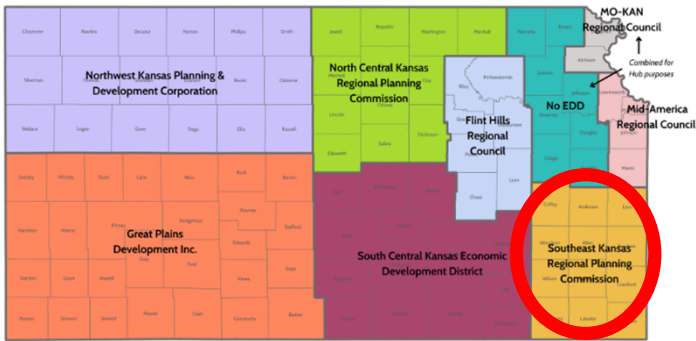
